This Morning's Music

Our introit is by Todd Marchand, an Episcopalian ordinand living in Texas. His setting of the Anglican collect is an acknowledgement that faith is a necessary component of any of our undertakings.

I am delighted that our small but oh so keen Children's Choir is participating in our service this morning. Peter Hurford's setting of the Robert Herrick text has been arranged for various choral permutations. Hurford, OBE, is a British organist and composer who was born on St. Cecilia's Day in Somerset and served as organist/choirmaster at St. Alban's Cathedral for 20 years. This anthem is sung by choirs world wide and has been described as "an exquisite miniature."

The English composer, Peter Aston, has held senior academic posts at the University of York and University of East Anglia, where he taught for twenty five years and is now Professor Emeritus. His compositions include songs, chamber works for voices and instruments, choral and orchestral works and a children's opera. However he is best known as a composer of church music.

The American composer Richard Horn takes his text from Philippians and weaves a beautiful organ accompaniment in and around the choral lines of our closing choral benediction.

The American composer Paul Manz died this past Wednesday at the age of 90. He served the church as a

recitalist, composer, teacher and leader in worship. He was Cantor Emeritus at the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Saint Luke, Chicago, as well as Cantor Emeritus of Mount Olive Lutheran Church in Minneapolis, Minnesota. His organ works are extensively used in worship services, recitals and in teaching and his choral music is widely performed by church and college choirs. His most famous work, "E'en So, Lord Jesus, Quickly Come" is regarded as a classic and will be sung by the choir at our Advent Carol service later this month.

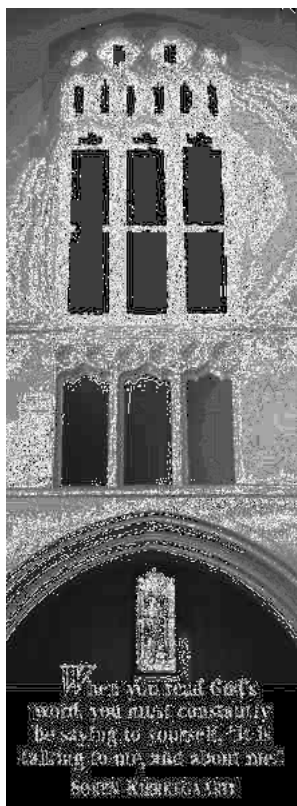

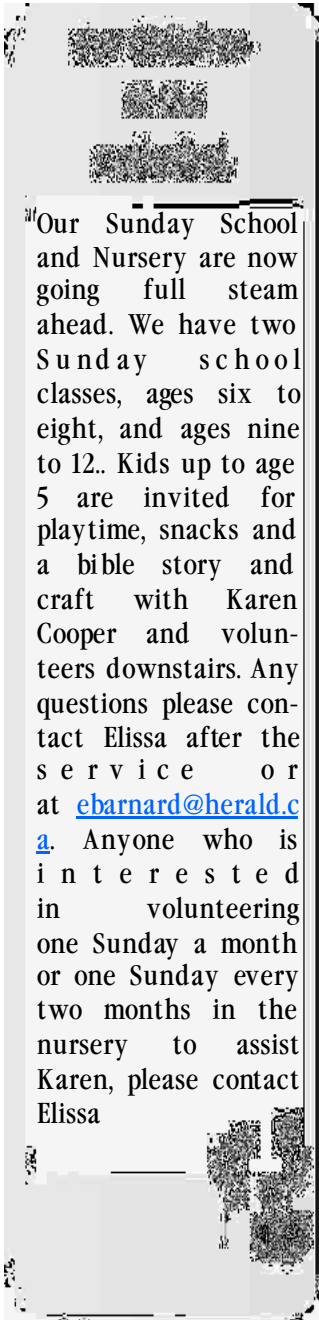
Christian's For Refugees Thank you

H1N1 Influenza

On April 29th Bishop Sue Moxley issued a letter to the clergy of the diocese in response to questions and concerns raised with respect to the H1N1 influenza virus. The relevance of this concern was heightened for us as many of the first reported cases here in Nova Scotia involved students of King's-Edgehill.

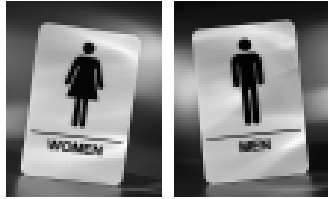
In her letter she affirms the necessity of safe practices with respect to such things as hand washing, and taking necessary precautions when coughing and sneezing.

While there has never been any evidence that sharing in the Common Cup poises significant risk to the spread of diseases, the practice of Intinction, that is dipping the host into the chalice, does present the possibility of contamination as hands and fingers are the biggest source of bacterial transfer. Therefore Intinction is in her words; "not an acceptable practice". For those who have practiced Intinction, and who do not wish to drink from the chalice, they should receive the bread only.

She concludes with this pastoral statement; "We must do what is appropriate to reduce the risk of disease, because we are about the ministry of healing. At the same time, we must continue to worship God and care for the people entrusted to our care"
