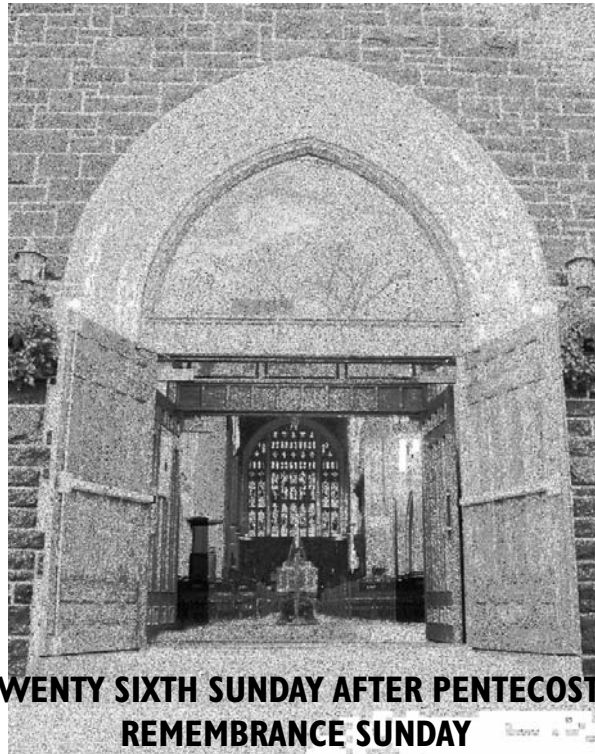

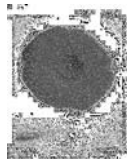

READINGS THIS WEEK

COLLECT

Amos 5:18-24

Alas for you who desire the day of the Lord! Why do you want the day of the Lord? It is darkness, not light; as if someone fled from a lion, and was met by a bear; or went into the house and rested a hand against the wall, and was bitten by a snake. Is not the day of the Lord darkness, not light, and gloom with no brightness in it? I hate, I despise your festivals, and I take no delight in your solemn assemblies. Even though you offer me your burnt offerings and grain offerings, I will not accept them; and the offerings of well-being of your fatted animals I will not look upon. Take away from me the noise of your songs; I will not listen to the melody of your harps. But let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an everflowing stream.

PSALM

REFRAIN The Lord split the rocks and gave them drink.

Hear my teaching, O my people; incline your ears to the words of my mouth. I will open my mouth in a parable; I will declare the mysteries of ancient times. **R** That which we have heard and known, and what our forefathers have told us, we will not hide from their children. We will recount to generations to come the praise-worthy deeds and the power of the Lord, and the wonderful works he has done. **R** He worked marvels in the sight of their forefathers, in the land of Egypt, in the field of Zoan. He split open the sea and let them pass

through; he made the waters stand up like walls. **R** He led them with a cloud by day, and all the night through with a glow of fire. He split the hard rocks in the wilderness and gave them drink as from the great deep. He brought streams out of the cliff, and the waters gushed out like rivers.

PSALM 78:1-4, 12-16

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died. For this we declare to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will by no means precede those who have died. For the Lord himself, with a cry of command, with the archangel's call and with the sound of God's trumpet, will descend from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air; and so we will be with the Lord forever. Therefore encourage one another with these words.

Matthew 25:1-13

Then the kingdom of heaven will be like this. Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. When the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil

with them; but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. As the bridegroom was delayed, all of them became drowsy and slept. But at midnight there was a shout, 'Look! Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.' Then all those bridesmaids got up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' But the wise replied, 'No! there will not be enough for you and for us; you had better go to the dealers and buy some for yourselves.' And while they went to buy it, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went with him into the wedding banquet; and the door was shut. Later the other bridesmaids came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' But he replied, 'Truly I tell you, I do not know you.' Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.

This Morning's Music

It is one of those serendipitous events when, on a morning when the reading from Thessalonians says, "For the Lord himself, with a cry of command, with the archangel's call and with the sound of God's trumpet..." and we have Jeffrey Stern guiding us through the Remembrance aspect of our service and playing the exuberant Stanley Voluntary as our postlude. Thanks are also extended to Ted Huck for his trombone underlay in the gradual. Teaching and preparedness would seem to be the themes emanating from our readings this morning. Thomas Attwood, that former pupil of Mozart now buried under the organ at St. Paul's Cathedral

was the composer of this morning's introit as well as many other pieces of Anglican service music. He was a friend of Mendelssohn and a teacher of John Goss who wrote, in addition to this morning's psalm chant, the music for that great hymn, "Praise, My Soul, the King of Heaven." Goss, by the way, was a teacher of Sir Arthur Sullivan. (Who knew that Sullivan's teaching pedigree extended back to Mozart?) It's not Advent quite yet but we get to hear two versions of the "Sleepers, Wake!" chorale. Our gradual is from the fourth movement of Cantata 140 and our offertory hymn is a reworking of that cantata's final movement. My Cape Breton friend Barry Peters' beautiful arrangement of the traditional Irish text concludes our worship.

Update on Phase II Development

Although the Phase II Development has taken a few twists and turns, we are making exciting progress!

Background

At a special meeting of the congregation in December 2007, approval was given to proceed with entering into a Letter of Intent with a developer who was proposing to build a combination commercial and long term care facility on the site of our current Anglican Diocesan Centre. With the rental income generated from this development, the Diocese and Cathedral Congregation proposed to build a new Diocesan Centre fronting Martello St. The new church building would house the current offices of Synod and Cathedral with common areas to support our respective activities. The new centre would meet our minimum space requirements but also be sustainable financially, funded by the lease of land to the developer and our current Diocesan Centre rents. The overall objective from the Cathedral Congregation's perspective of the Phase II Development is to provide a financially sustainable physical space that allows us to carry out our Vision. The significant required maintenance of the current Diocesan Centre will quickly become unsustainable for our congregation.

Current Status

The Letter of Intent contemplated at our December 2007 meeting was not

executed because the proposed developer could not come to terms with a tenant for the long term care facility. However, the Phase II Committee (with representatives of Dean & Chapter, Synod, and the Congregation) began discussions on a Letter of Intent with a new party. Although the new Letter of Intent is not ready for presentation to each of the church parties, the new concept for the development appears like a significant improvement over the previous proposal. We are now considering building the new Diocesan Centre between the new development at the corner of Martello and College Streets and the Cathedral. The new centre would be connected to the Cathedral and accessed in a similar manner, through a new breezeway, out the north transept door. The new centre would be on one level, eliminating any issues with access. I will hopefully be coming to the Congregation with more details in the near future to seek approval to move forward with our new partner.

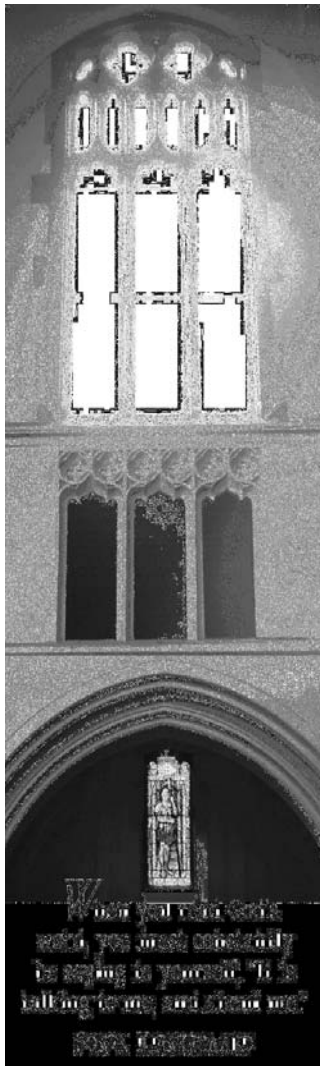

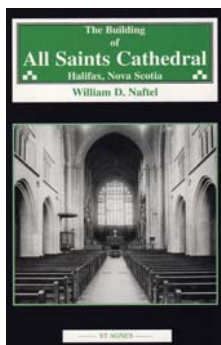
Peace Petition: Sowing Seeds of Peace and Action
